THE SERIES:

W&L and Hampden-Sydney will be meeting for the 106th time and the Tigers claim a 65-40 series edge. H-SC has won 17 straight in the series, a stretch which dates back to a 44-40 W&L win at Hampden-Sydney during the 1997-98 season. **W&L and Lynchburg** will meet for the 99th time, with the Generals posting a 67-31 advantage in the all-time series. Lynchburg have won each of the last three meetings, breaking a streak of four wins in five games for W&L over the Hornets from 2001-04.

THE HEAD GENERAL:

Adam Hutchinson (Amherst '93) is in his third season as the head coach at Washington and Lee. Prior to W&L, Hutchinson coached for two seasons at Case Western Reserve University and two seasons at Stevens Tech. In his seven seasons as a head coach, Hutchinson claims a 44-123 (.264) overall record. Hutchinson is assisted by **Ryan Kadlubowski (Rochester '03)** and **Curtis Buxton**.

SCOUTING HAMPDEN-SYDNEY:

The Tigers are 13-6 overall and 7-6 in the ODAC following a 62-55 loss to Bridgewater on Monday evening. H-SC shot just 35.8 percent from the floor, including 26.1 percent in the second half, and committed 20 turnovers in the game. Sophomore forward **Drew Prehmus** led Sydney with 13 points, four rebounds and four assists, while junior guard **Mike Edwards** added nine points. The Tigers leading scorer, **Troy Kaase** did not play in the game. On the season, Kaase averages 18.7 points and 7.0 rebounds per contest while shooting 60.6 percent from the floor. Prehmus averages 11.4 points and 5.8 rebounds per outing, while Edwards adds 10.4 points per game. Overall, H-SC has dropped six of its last eight games after starting the season 11-0.

LAST MEETING WITH HAMPDEN-SYDNEY:

Sophomore forward **Troy Kaase** rebounded a miss by sophomore forward **Drew Prehmus** and layed the ball in with 4.3 seconds remaining to give 11th-ranked Hampden-Sydney a 58-57 win over Washington and Lee at the Warner Center. The Generals trailed just three times in the second half and led by seven points (47-40) with 9:15 remaining in the game. From there, a 9-2 Tiger run knotted the game at 49-49 with 4:41 remaining. The game would be tied on three other occasions in the final minutes and a three-pointer by Tiger junior guard **Mike Edwards** with 1:40 remaining gave H-SC a 56-55 lead. However, W&L assumed a 57-56 lead with 1:19 remaining on a pair of free throws by junior guard **Chris Halkitis** and neither team could find the bucket until Kaase's game-winner. W&L was led by sophomore forward **Greg Bienemann**, who tallied 15 points and five rebounds. Junior forward **Alex White** tied a career-high with 11 points, while Halkitis totaled 10 points and five assists. Hampden-Sydney was paced by Kaase's 17 points and four rebounds. Edwards finished with 13 points, while Prehmus registered nine points and a game-high eight rebounds.

SCOUTING LYNCHBURG:

Lynchburg is 3-17 overall and 3-10 in the ODAC following an 83-73 loss to Eastern Mennonite on Monday evening. The Hornets allowed EMU to shoot 64.4 percent from the floor and were out-rebounded 35-25 in the game. Senior forward **Patrick Prior** paced five Hornets in double figures with 16 points and five rebounds. Junior center **Peter Vasiliou**, and senior guards **Matt Sweeney** and **Andy Albright** each tallied 12 points, while senior forward **David Sheaffer** contributed 10 points. For the year, Sweeney leads the team in scoring, averaging 10.7 points per game. Prior averages 9.8 points and 4.5 rebounds per game, and Albright averages 9.1 points, 4.4 rebounds, 2.5 steals and 1.9 assists per contest. As a team, the Hornets shoot just 39.0 percent from the floor and are being outrebounded by an average of 7.1 boards per outing.

LAST MEETING WITH LYNCHBURG:

Sophomore guard **Kwame Safo** knocked down a jumper with 1.3 seconds left to lift Lynchburg to a 62-60 victory over Washington and Lee in Lynchburg, Va. The Hornets last lead of the game was at the 12:51 mark of the first half when they held a 13-12 advantage. The Generals went ahead 14-13 on a layup by sophomore forward **Greg Bienemann** and went into halftime with a 10-point edge at 34-24. In the second half, W&L extended its advantage to 14 points at 40-26 with 17:50 remaining, but Lynchburg slowly chipped away at the deficit and knotted the game at 57-57 at the 4:40 mark. The Generals recaptured the lead at 60-57 with 3:37 left on a three-pointer by junior guard **Chris Halkitis**. The Hornets then tied the game at 60-60 on a free throw by senior guard **Andy Albright** with 42 seconds remaining. Albright then stole the ball with 15 seconds left, which set up Safo's game-winning shot. Bienemann led the Generals with 20 points and 15 rebounds, while Halkitis finished with 12 points. Sophomore guard **John Mumper** added 11 points and five boards. Lynchburg was led by senior guard **Matthew Sweeney's** 21 points on 9-of-13 shooting. Albright tallied 15 points and seven rebounds.

LAST TIME OUT:

Sophomore forward **Josh LaPorte** notched 13 points and eight rebounds to lead Roanoke to a 62-46 victory over Washington and Lee last Saturday evening in Salem, Va. The Generals jumped out to an 8-2 lead with 18:07 remaining in the first half, but scored just 11 points in the rest of the half to trail 30-19 at the break. Following halftime, the Maroons pushed their lead to as many as 29 points (54-25) with 7:55 left en route to the 16-point victory. Roanoke shot 46.3 percent (25-of-54) from the field and forced 26 W&L turnovers, while the Generals shot just 35.7 percent (15-of-42) from the floor. W&L was led by sophomore guard **John Mumper**, who scored a team-high nine points. Freshman forward **Ben Heller** tallied seven points and four rebounds, while sophomore forward **Femi Kusimo** also notched seven points. LaPorte was aided by sophomore guard Ben Shrader, who scored nine points.

STRONG START = STRONG FINISH:

A quick start has been imperative to the Generals winning games. Over the past eight years, W&L is 33-23 (.589) when leading at the half. During that same stretch, W&L has won a total of 46 games, meaning that W&L has led at the break in almost 72 percent of its wins during the last eight years.

HARD LUCK GENERALS:

The Generals have dropped eight in a row, but they have been playing some good basketball games regardless of the outcome. Three of those games were determined by five points or less with one loss coming in overtime. A 62-60 loss at Lynchburg was sealed by a jumper with 1.3 seconds remaining, while a 58-57 setback to Hampden-Sydney occurred on a stickback basket with 4.3 seconds left. The Generals also took 17th-ranked Randolph-Macon to overtime before falling by four points (71-67). All told, W&L has dropped six games by six points or less this season.

KUSIMO RETURNS:

Sophomore forward **Femi Kusimo** has returned from a broken foot that sidelined him for eight games. Kusimo's last action was in a 98-92 win over Guilford on Dec. 7, before returning to the court in a 62-46 loss at Roanoke last Saturday. In that game, he scored seven points, grabbed two rebounds, blocked a shot and notched a steal in just 12 minutes of action. In the opening nine games of the season before being sidelined, Kusimo ranked second on the team in scoring and rebounding.

MOVING UP THE CHARTS:

With his 31 made three-pointers this season (31-85), junior guard **Chris Halkitis** has moved into a tie for third place on the W&L all-time three-pointers list with 129 makes. He can move into second place with eight more three pointers. For his career, Halkitis has drilled 129-of-354 (.364) three-point attempts.

CAST OF THOUSANDS:

W&L claims a deep team in 2005-06 as 11 players are averaging 10 or more minutes per game. Junior guard **Chris Halkitis** leads the way with a team-best 30.2 minutes per game. Additionally, 10 different players have recorded a double-digit scoring game led by sophomore forward **Greg Bienemann**, who has tallied double-digits in 12 contests. Halkitis claims 10 games of 10 or more points and freshman guard **Isaiah Goodman** has five games of 10 or more points.

NO SURPRISE:

It's no surprise that junior guard **Chris Halkitis** and sophomore forward **Greg Bienemann** are leading the team's scoring punch this season. Halkitis is averaging 9.2 points per game and just passed the 700 career-point plateau (711). Bienemann leads the team with an average of 12.7 points per game and just passed the 500 career-point mark (519). W&L has not claimed a 1,000-point scorer since Cam Dyer '96 finished his career with 1,508 career points. All told, 20 players in the school's history have achieved the prestigious milestone.
