THE SERIES:

W&L and Denison will be meeting for the first-time ever on the hardwood. Saturday's consolation or championship could feature a game against either SUNY-Oneonta or Averett. W&L has never faced Oneonta, but carries a 6-2 all-time record against Averett, including an 82-67 victory over the Cougars in the last meeting back on Jan. 28, 2004 at the Warner Center.

THE HEAD GENERAL:

Adam Hutchinson (Amherst '93) is in his fourth season as the head coach at Washington and Lee. Prior to W&L, Hutchinson coached for two seasons at Case Western Reserve University and two seasons at Stevens Tech. In his eight seasons as a head coach, Hutchinson claims a 46-125 (.269) overall record. Hutchinson is assisted by **Ryan Kadlubowski (Rochester '03)** and **Stuart Pradia (Brandeis '05)**.

LAST TIME OUT:

Jordan Snipes went 1-of-2 from the free throw line with five seconds left to lift Guilford to a 75-74 win over Washington and Lee in its 2005-06 season finale back on February 14 in Greensboro, N.C. The Generals trailed 74-67 with 2:22 remaining, but went on a 7-0 run to tie the game at 74-74 with 15 seconds left on a layup by forward **Femi Kusimo**, setting up Snipes' game-winning free throw. The Quakers led 37-29 at halftime and pushed their lead to nine points (40-31) with 18:53 remaining in the game, but W&L went on a 10-0 spurt to take a 41-40 advantage at the 13:18 mark. Guilford retook the lead at 48-46 with 10:16 left and held the lead until Kusimo's game-tying layup. The Generals were led by guard **Isaiah Goodman**, who scored a career-high 17 points, grabbed six rebounds and collected four steals. Guard **John Mumper** tallied 16 points, five boards and three assists, while Kusimo finished with 14 points and a team-high nine rebounds.

LAST MEETING WITH AVERETT:

Forward Phil Landes scored a career-high 20 points and tied a career-high with seven rebounds in leading Washington and Lee to an 82-67 win over Averett at the Warner Center back on January 28, 2004. The Generals used a 16-2 run late in the first half to push a 23-16 lead with 6:33 remaining to a 39-19 advantage with 2:04 to play in leading 41-25 at the break. The Cougars started the second half with a 9-2 run to cut the W&L lead to seven points (43-36) with 15:31 remaining, but could get no closer despite the Generals hitting just 18-of-34 (.529) foul shots for the game. Guard Coleman Lyons and senior forward Hamill Jones supplemented Landes' night with 14 points each. Guard **Chris Halkitis** added 10 rebounds. Averett was paced by forward **Andrew Boor**, who totaled 18 points. Guard Jerrod Harris added 17 points and eight rebounds.

SCOUTING THE TOURNAMENT FIELD:

AVERETT - The Cougars finished last season with a 20-8 overall record and advanced to the USA South Championship game before falling to Christopher Newport, 89-88. The Cougars return several starters this season, including junior guard **Cory McDaniel** and senior forward **Andrew Boor**. McDaniel averaged 10.8 points per game a year ago after hitting a team-best 62 three-pointers. He was tabbed a Second Team All-USA South selection. Boor averaged 9.3 points and grabbed 5.0 rebounds per game.

DENISON - The Big Red completed the 2005-06 season with a 10-16 overall record and advanced to the North Coast Athletic Conference quarterfinals before falling to eventual national runner-up Wittenberg, 83-61. Denison returns four starters to the fold this winter, including senior forward **Dan Hodgkinson**, who garnered Second Team All-NCAC honors after averaging 18.1 points and 6.6 rebounds per game, while shooting 59.2 percent from the field. Senior forward **Dan Izzo** also returns after averaging 7.7 points and 4.0 rebounds per contest.

ONEONTA STATE - The Red Dragons finished the 2005-06 campaign with a 9-16 overall record and return four starters to the new season. Injuries plagued Oneonta last season as seniors **William Heslin** and **Kevin Reed** both missed much of the season. Senior forward **Jaysen Murphy** and senior guard **Michael Reardon** picked up the slack for the losses with 11.8 and 7.0 points per game, respectively. Murphy was an Honorable Mention All-SUNYAC selection.

STRONG START = STRONG FINISH:

A quick start has been imperative to the Generals winning games. Over the past nine years, W&L is 34-23 (.597) when leading at the half. During that same stretch, W&L has won a total of 48 games, meaning that W&L has led at the break in just over 70 percent of its wins during the last nine years.

FOR OPENERS:

Washington and Lee will be playing in its 20th season-opening tournament since the 1970-71 season. The Generals are 13-25 (.342) in those contests and have won three tournament championships (1987, 1988, 2002 W&L Tip-off Tournaments). The Generals also won the 2005 Washington and Lee Tournament, which was held in January.

WHAT'S BACK:

W&L returns all five starters from last season's team, which finished with a 4-19 overall record. Junior forward **Greg Bienemann** headlines the list of returnees after garnering Honorable Mention All-ODAC honors last season when he averaged a team-best 12.1 points and a team-high 6.6 rebounds per game. Senior guard **Chris Halkitis** also returns after averaging 9.3 points, 2.7 rebounds and 2.1 assists per game last winter. An Honorable Mention All-ODAC selection as a freshman in 2003-04, Halkitis ranks third in W&L history with 134 career three-pointers and claims 760 career points. Junior forward **John Mumper** (9.0 ppg., 2.3 rpg.), sophomore guard **Isaiah Goodman** (8.9 ppg., 2.2 rpg.) and senior forward **Alex White** (4.4 ppg., 3.0 rpg.) also return after starting for the Generals last season. A sixth player, junior forward **Femi Kusimo**, could be considered a returning starter after playing in 14 games with 10 starts. Kusimo averaged 9.7 points and 5.6 rebounds per game, but missed the middle stretch of the season due to a foot injury.
