COMMANDING THE GENERALS:

Mandy King (Southern Maine '98) is in her second season as head women's basketball coach at W&L. She posted a 9-17 in her first year at the helm and has a career record of 16-23. King's first season resulted in a six-game improvement over the previous campaign and included a bid to the ODAC Postseason Tournament. Under her direction, two players earned All-ODAC honors and another finished second in the balloting for the conference rookie of the year award. **Dean'na Mitchelson (Virginia '02)** is in her first season as assistant women's basketball coach at W&L. Prior to her arrival, Mitchelson served as head women's basketball coach at Robert E. Lee High School during the 2003-04 season. Mitchelson captained the women's basketball team at the University of Virginia where she was a four-year letterwinner.

OPPOSING COACHES:

Head coach **Richie Waggoner (Roanoke '92)** has a 65-73 career record in his six seasons at the helm of Lynchburg. **Melissa Wiggins** has posted a 24-134 career record during her seven seasons as head coach of Randolph-Macon Woman's College.

ALL-TIME SERIES:

W&L is 9-11 all-time against Lynchburg and 16-6 against Randolph-Macon Woman's College. The Generals split their two meetings with Lynchburg last season, losing 70-61 at Lynchburg before winning 62-60 in Lexington. W&L also split the two games against the WildCats last year. It won 63-51 in Lexington, but dropped a 57-41 decision at RMWC.

UP NEXT:

The Generals play two home games next week. They host Bridgewater on Tuesday, Jan. 18 at 7:00 pm and Southern Virginia on Friday, Jan. 21 at 7:00 pm.

LAST TIME OUT:

No. 16 Randolph-Macon outscored Washington and Lee, 47-30, in the second half to defeat the Generals, 73-61, on Thursday night at the Warner Center. The first half was closely contested as there were 10 ties and neither team held a lead larger than four points until the Yellow Jackets took a 26-21 lead with 5:30 remaining in the first half. The Generals responded with a 10-0 run to close the half and take a 31-26 advantage into halftime. Randolph-Macon then opened the second half on a 15-5 run to take a 41-36 lead with 16:23 remaining second half, while the Generals were just 10-for-26 (.390). W&L was led by freshman forward **Kristen Krouchick**, who scored a team-high 15 points on 7-for-11 shooting. Senior forward **Emily Barker** set season-highs with 12 points and nine rebounds and dished out a career-best four assists. Senior guard **Bethany Dannelly** tallied nine points, five rebounds, and handed out a team-high seven assists.

SCOUTING THE HORNETS:

Lynchburg has an overall record of 6-6 and a 3-4 mark in the ODAC. The Hornets fell to Bridgewater, 80-58, on Sunday. Lynchburg fell behind 24-9 and trailed 37-24 at halftime. It shot just 29 percent (9-for-31) in the first half, including 0-for-6 from behind the arc. Junior forward **Lacey Currie** and senior guard **Shannon Newton** each had 13 points and two rebounds for the Hornets. Sophomore forward **Caroline Cabbage** added four points and pulled down a game-high nine rebounds. Currie averages a team-high 13.1 points and 4.5 rebounds per game, while sophomore center **Caroline Wesley** is second on the team in scoring (13.0 ppg) and leads the team in rebounding (10.4 rpg), blocks (2.3 bpg), and steals (1.8 spg).

SCOUTING THE WILDCATS:

Randolph-Macon Woman's College has an overall record of 1-9 and a 1-6 mark in the ODAC. The WildCats lost to No. 16 Randolph-Macon, 74-46, on Tuesday. RMWC shot 6-for-23 (.261) from the floor in the first half and trailed 37-19 at halftime. It was also outrebounded, 53-38. Junior forward **Megan Stensrud** recorded a double-double with 25 points and 12 rebounds. She was 10-for-13 from the free throw line. Stensrud averages a team-high 17.6 points, 8.5 rebounds, and 1.0 blocks per game. Sophomore guard **Annie Johnson** leads the team in assists (3.0 apg) and steals (3.1 spg) and is second in scoring (11.3 ppg). Junior forward **Jennifer Prewitt** averages 7.1 points and a team-best 12.9 rebounds per game.

LAST MEETING WITH LYNCHBURG (2/10/04):

Forward Sarah Michaels drilled a three-pointer with 4.2 seconds remaining to push the Washington and Lee women's basketball team past Lynchburg, 62-60. The Generals trailed 58-53 with 2:30 remaining, but took a 59-58 lead with 44 seconds left on a layup by center **Jessica Hunsinger**. Lynchburg retook the lead at 60-59 with 18 seconds remaining, which set up Michaels game-winning shot. Michaels led W&L with 18 points and eight rebounds. Hunsinger also grabbed eight boards and contributed 17 points, while guard **Louisa Feve** rounded out the Generals' double-digit scorers with 12 points.

LAST MEETING WITH RMWC (2/3/04):

Washington and Lee shot just 24.1 percent (14-for-58) from the field in falling to Randolph-Macon Woman's College, 57-41. The Generals led the contest 15-14 with 9:53 remaining in the opening half, but the WildCats closed the half on a 15-7 run to assume a 29-22 edge at the break. W&L pulled to within six points (45-39) with 4:18 to play, but couldn't get any closer. W&L was paced by forward Sarah Michaels, who tallied 14 points and 12 rebounds. Center **Jessica Hunsinger** added 12 points and a game-high 16 boards.

BARK-ING UP THE RIGHT TREE:

Senior forward **Emily Barker** is having a solid season off the bench for the Generals. She is averaging 5.3 points, 4.2 rebounds and 1.0 assist per game in 19 minutes of action. She is also shooting 31-for-59 (.525) from the field. In a 73-61 loss to No. 16 Randolph-Macon on Thursday, Barker set season-highs with 12 points and nine rebounds and tied her career high with four assists.

GETTING DEFENSIVE PART I:

Washington and Lee has held its opponents to 56.9 points per game on 34.6 percent shooting (27th in the nation), including 27.2 percent from three-point range. Only three teams have shot above 40 percent and all three came in W&L losses (Randolph-Macon, 42.4 percent, in a 69-56 victory on Dec. 4, Virginia Wesleyan, 40.3 percent, in an 80-68 win on Dec. 5, and Randolph-Macon, 53.6 percent, in a 73-61 win on Jan. 13). The Generals have held four opponents under 29 percent shooting and they won all four games. In a 69-36 victory over Russell Sage on Nov. 20, the Gators were just 13-for-64 (.203) from the field.

GETTING DEFENSIVE PART II:

The Generals are 6-1 this season when they hold their opponents to 59 points or less, but are 1-5 when the opposition scores at least 60 points. W&L also forces 20.3 turnovers a game and collects just over 11 steals a game. In the 79-56 win over Mary Baldwin, the Generals tied a school record by swiping 21 steals from the Fighting Squirrels.

ODAC BEST PART I:

The Generals have several players ranked among the elite in the ODAC. Senior guard **Bethany Dannelly** leads the ODAC in assists (4.9 apg) and is third in steals (2.9 spg). Sophomore center **Jessica Hunsinger** is fourth in the conference in rebounds (9.1 rpg), fifth in blocks (1.7 bpg), and seventh in field goal percentage (.466, 69-for-148). Freshman forward **Kristen Krouchick** is second in field goal percentage (.540, 75-for-139) and sixth in scoring (14.2 ppg). Junior guard **Louisa Feve** is fifth in assists (3.9 apg), sixth in three-pointers made per game (1.7) and seventh in scoring (13.5 ppg).

ODAC BEST PART II:

W&L is also among the best in several team categories. It is second in the ODAC in field goal percentage (.409, 306-for-749) and assists (14.6), while ranked third in scoring defense (56.9 ppg) and fourth in field goal percentage defense (.346, 279-for-806).
